


What is ESOL?

ESOL stands for **English for Speakers of Other Languages**



Language Acquisition

Language acquisition happens very quickly with social language (1-3 years) but takes much longer with academic language. It can take a student 7-10 years to develop grade-level native-like fluency in all domains (Thomas and Collier, 1995).



Who are our Glasgow MLs?

- 1,186 total MLs @ GLASGOW
 - 658 currently active in the ESOL program (Levels 1-4)
 - 528 former MLs
- 39 languages
- 54 countries

*Fun fact: 70% of students at Glasgow have a home language other than English.

Home Language Survey

- A document returned upon public school enrollment
- Results from initial English language testing determine if student is eligible for ESOL services according to federal regulations

Courses

- □ WIDA exam scores
- Grades/course history
- □ SOL and other test scores

WIDA Assessment

- Measures students' language skill levels in *academic* English
- Delivered once a year (Jan.-March)
- English skills assessed
 - -Reading
 - -Writing
 - -Listening
 - -Speaking

WIDA Performance Definitions

At the given level of English language proficiency, English language learners will process, understand, produce or use:

6- Reaching	 specialized or technical language reflective of the content areas at grade level a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in settended oral or written discourse as required by the specified grade level oral or written communication in English comparable to English-proficient peers
5- Bridging	specialized or technical language of the content areas a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in extended oral or written discourse, including stories, essays or reports oral or written language approaching comparability to that of English- proficient peers when presented with grade level material
4- Expanding	 specific and some technical language of the content areas a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in oral discourse or multiple, related sentences or pragraphs oral or written language with minimal phonological, syntactic or semantic errors that do not impede the overall meaning of the communication when presented with oral or written connected discourse with sensory, graphic or interactive support
3- Developing	 general and some specific language of the content areas expanded sentences in oral interaction or written paragraphs oral or written hanguage with phonological, syntactic or semantic errors that may impede the communication, but retain much of its meaning, when presented with oral or written, narrative or expository descriptions with sensory, graphic or interactive support
2- Beginning	 general language related to the content areas phrases or short sentences or all or written language with phonological, syntactic, or semantic errors that often impede the meaning of the communication when presented with one- to multiple-step commands, directions, questions, or a series of statements with sensory, graphic or interactive support
1- Entering	 pictorial or graphic representation of the language of the content areas words, phrases or chunks of language when presented with one-step commands, directions, WF4, choice or yes/no questions, or statements with sensory, regraphic or interactive support oral language with phonological, syntactic, or semantic errors that often imped meaning when presented with basic oral commands, direct questions, or simpli- statements with sensory, regulacion errors the support
